


Carondelet is powerful.

The Arts at the Heart of Carondelet:
A LEGACY OF UNIFYING LOVE AND CREATIVE ACTION

As Principal of Academics, I spend a great deal of time thinking about curriculum: what we teach, how we teach it, and why it matters. In this 60th anniversary year, I find myself looking both forward and backward, and in doing so, I am struck by how central the arts have always been to the Carondelet story. They are not an accessory to our academic life. They are part of our DNA.

Contemporary thinker Daniel Pink argues that as routine analytical work becomes increasingly automated, education must intentionally cultivate human capacities that cannot be outsourced, including creativity, empathy, design, and big-picture thinking. He maintains that the arts are not enrichment or electives, but core disciplines because they develop the skills that give learning meaning and prepare students for economic and civic life. As Pink writes, "Artists give people something they didn't know they were missing." In many ways, this insight mirrors what the Sisters of St. Joseph understood long before the phrase "future-ready skills" entered our vocabulary.

From our origins, the arts were never ornamental. The Sisters used lacemaking both as a means of supporting themselves and as a craft they could teach women so they, too, could earn a living. It was practical and beautiful at the same time, requiring patience, precision, imagination, and care. The work

met a real need while honoring dignity and creativity. Meeting the needs of the time demanded nimble thinking, creative solutions, open ears and hearts. Those same qualities remain essential today.

In our art classrooms, students develop rigor and self-direction, two qualities consistently cited by employers as essential. They learn to revise, to persist through frustration, to receive critique, and to trust their own creative voice. This reinforces a simple but powerful truth: the arts are fundamental, not ornamental.

But art at Carondelet goes well beyond the art classroom. Much like our faith, it is woven into the fabric of our academic program, present not as an isolated subject, but as a way of engaging the world. This begins in the freshman year with Frosh Creation: Think, Make, Share, a course that is itself a quiet nod to our founders. Through design thinking and collaboration, our youngest students explore how artistic forms can serve as vehicles for problem-solving, expression, and creation rooted in empathy and purpose. They learn early on that creativity is not about talent alone, but about attentiveness, courage, and care.





Our commitment to the arts is also reflected in our deep partnership with De La Salle. Our students sing together, perform together, and create together. Choir at Carondelet and band at De La Salle are open to all students. “Company,” our shared theatre program, and the Winton Arts Festival celebrate talent from both schools side by side. Our choir competes at the national level, brings home awards, and represents Carondelet beyond campus, including most recently singing the national anthem at a Warriors’ game. These moments matter not only because of their excellence, but because they model collaboration, discipline, and shared joy.

Our dance program also deserves special recognition. For years, our dancers have performed at the national level, winning competitions and representing Carondelet with excellence and pride. They are a visible presence at sporting events, rallies, and family gatherings, embodying discipline, athleticism, and expressive artistry. Dance reminds us that learning is embodied, and that confidence is often built through movement. This year, their work is finally matched by space. Thanks to the *Power of Her* campaign, our dancers will gain a true home in a new movement studio designed to honor their craft and support their growth. It is a tangible reminder that when we invest in the arts, we invest in students’ bodies, voices, and confidence.

The arts at Carondelet also live at the intersection of creativity and service. In our Engineering for Social Good course, students bring together science, heart,

and design as they build furniture to meet the needs of our local community. This work requires technical precision, aesthetic consideration, empathy, and collaboration. Students imagine the lived experience of the people they are serving and translate that understanding into something functional, durable, and dignifying. It is a powerful example of how artistic thinking, paired with engineering, becomes a force for justice and compassion.

At the same time, new creative opportunities continue to emerge. Winton Film Fest invites submissions from local junior high and high school students and culminates in a film festival hosted in our Jean Hofmann Center for Innovation, giving students an authentic audience for their work. Our student-led Early Early Show allows students to flex their creative energy while keeping the student community informed and connected. Music Ministry offers another powerful space where faith and artistic expression meet, reminding us that prayer, too, can be embodied, sung, and shared.

Our Wellness Counselors also recognize the restorative and grounding power of artistic expression, intentionally creating space for art-based reflection and creative recharge. In moments of stress or transition, students are reminded that creativity can be a source of healing and balance.

As a society, we often privilege efficiency, speed, and standardization. Yet it is imagination, empathy, and meaning-making that have carried humanity through centuries and continue to illuminate the path forward. Sixty years in, Carondelet remains rooted in this wisdom. The power of her education has always included the power of the arts, and it always will.

Le Puy Pilgrimage: UNIFYING LOVE FOR 375 YEARS

Along with Jessica Mix, in May 2025, I joined Mount Saint Mary's University's annual pilgrimage to France to immerse ourselves in the story of the Sisters of St. Joseph. As someone who has

been part of the Carondelet community for over 20 years, I have heard and internalized the rich narrative of the Sisters from their founding in Le Puy, through the trials of the French Revolution, to their refounding under the care and leadership of Mother St. John Fontbonne. Yet there is a different kind of knowing that comes from walking the streets where the founding six CSJ Sisters once walked, standing in the kitchen where they shared the needs of the people they served, and holding the cane that supported Mother St. John Fontbonne toward the end of her life.


Encountering the CSJ story in this way is both a gift and a challenge. This pilgrimage was not only about learning more deeply from the past, but also about accompanying my fellow pilgrim partners in the CSJ mission who serve in a variety of roles and ministries. Through shared experience, conversation, movement,

and prayer, we reflected together on how this way of life continues to shape our own vocations and work. In these collective spaces, we also wrestled with how the witness of these women invites us to respond to the needs of our own time.

We happened to be on pilgrimage during the 375th anniversary of the founding of the Sisters of St. Joseph. To recognize myself as part of this living mission, one that has been carried forward across centuries and continents, is both humbling and deeply inspiring.


Now back at Carondelet, carrying memories of the towns, churches, food, and fellowship of the pilgrimage, I see what those first six women in Le Puy began continuing in our own columned halls. Educating and preparing young women of heart, faith, courage, and excellence to meet the challenges of their day and to co-create just and loving communities advances the spirit of unifying love that has always been at the center of this work. This year marks the 60th anniversary of Carondelet High School, and it is fitting that the theme of this publication is the *Power of Her*. Carondelet students challenge themselves academically,

CAMPUS MINISTRY

VEN A VER DC



As a school devoted to forming women of courage who advocate for a more socially just world, our Ven a Ver program invites students to work towards justice, solidarity, and the flourishing of all God's people. On Ven a Ver DC, where students participate in the Ignatian Family Teach-in for Justice and Advocacy Day, students learn that faith and justice are intricately linked. The attending juniors and seniors experience a personal conversion toward living a life of advocacy for and solidarity with the poor and marginalized in our world.

From November 15 to 17, 2025, 10 Carondelet students and staff members, Vanessa Miranda and Sarah Guzzaldo, participated in this annual conference along with over 1,800 attendees from North and Central America. Each year, the Teach-In addresses timely issues through two days of dynamic speakers, breakout sessions, and networking opportunities. The first keynote speaker of the event was Jesuit Fr. Greg Boyle, founder of Homeboy Industries in Los Angeles, the largest gang-intervention, rehabilitation, and re-entry program in the world.

On the last morning, the group gathered for a public witness in front of the U.S. Capitol building before their scheduled meeting with Congressman Mark Desaulnier's office. There, they met with the Congressman's legislative assistant to advocate for dignity-affirming migration and ecological policies. Recently, the legislative assistant reached out to Campus Minister Vanessa Miranda to thank the group for their meeting. The Carondelet delegation's advocacy resulted in the Congressman's co-sponsorship of migration-related legislation.

Later this semester, the group will gather for post-trip action-planning meetings to discuss continued faith-based advocacy for these issues at school. They plan to share their experience at Carondelet's annual Service and Advocacy Prayer liturgy, as well as participate in state-level civic engagement in Sacramento.

LACROSSE





ATHLETICS HIGHLIGHTS



CROSS COUNTRY



The Carondelet Cross Country team enjoyed a landmark 2025 season, fueled by individual growth, personal records, and unity. Leading the charge for the Varsity squad, Gretchen Yakaitis '26 committed to run at the collegiate level, delivered standout performances, securing first-place finishes and claiming individual titles at both the NCS and CIF State Championships. These performances led the Cougars to a 4th place NCS podium finish and a 14th place ranking at State.

FLAG FOOTBALL



In 2025, Carondelet's inaugural Varsity Flag Football team made history as the school's first squad. Overcoming early learning curves with high energy, the Cougars found their rhythm mid-season to secure dominant wins. Beyond the scoreboard, this trailblazing team built deep sisterly bonds, laying a strong foundation for the program's future.

GOLF



Carondelet JV and Varsity Golf teams finished the 2025 season with perfect, undefeated records. The Varsity squad claimed the East Bay Athletic League championship and NCS 1st place champions. After placing third at NorCals, the Cougars took 5th at the CIF State Championship. Varsity team members Lily Peng '27 (Rolex Junior All-American) and Katherine Keith '27 (Rolex Scholastic All-American) earned top honors for their elite performances.

RUGBY



Carondelet's Rugby program excelled in 2025, demonstrating resilience across both A-side and B-side teams. By honing technical skills and teamwork, the Cougars secured key wins in the NorCal High School Rugby League. The season concluded with strong momentum, solidifying the team's standing as a respected and tough Northern California program.

TENNIS



Carondelet Tennis embraced a rebuilding season in 2025, welcoming 11 new players to the program. Despite a fresh roster, the team displayed grit in competitive three-set matches. Focused on unity and Sisterhood, these athletes established a strong foundation and commitment that sets a promising tone for the program's future success.

VOLLEYBALL



Carondelet Volleyball reached new heights this season under the leadership of Head Varsity Coach Stephanie Cline (NFHS Coach of the Year). All levels placed top-four in every tournament. The Cougars captured the NCS Division 1 Championship for the first time in 21 years and were recognized for CIF's Army National Guard Team of the Month for December.

WATER POLO



Carondelet Water Polo made history in 2025, capturing a #1 national ranking and a 28-1 record. The Varsity squad secured the "triple crown" of EBAL, NCS, and NorCal championships. This dominant season featured seven seniors from the Class of 2026, five of whom have committed to play collegiately: Taylor Chestnut, Josie Haast, Clara O'Conner, Kayden Page, and Sarah Wright.

SOCCER



During the 2025-26 season, all three levels of the Carondelet Soccer program maintained excellent winning records. The Varsity team led the way, finishing first in the



ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT

Your philanthropic support, volunteer efforts, and engagement with school life during the 2024–25 year helped raise over \$2M in contributed income, 162% of our goal. This success was driven by creative fundraising efforts—dynamic events, annual sponsorship opportunities, and targeted initiatives—and this community’s sustained responsiveness to the needs of the times. Our supporters rose to the occasion to keep Carondelet on the cutting edge of whole-person secondary education and used philanthropy to maintain the exceptional experience our students and their families expect and deserve.




We also raised an additional **\$1.5M** for our **Power of Her** Campaign. This fundraising effort, which ran the duration of the 2024–25 fiscal year, helped launch construction and propel the project into its final stages.

This level of contributed income speaks to the collective vote of confidence our community has in our mission and vision. The challenges incumbent in fundraising persist, and we consistently must do more with less. More tax-deductible support is needed to maintain the programs we have and more is needed to preserve the ambitious trajectory we have established on behalf of our students. We are approximately 90% reliant on tuition and other income, and depend on your continued investment to close this gap each year. Our generous community of donors helps address this shortfall with philanthropic contributions.

FINANCIAL AID

Approximately 51% of Carondelet students receive some form of financial aid, including \$2.67 million in need-based grants and merit awards.





Maria arrived at Carondelet shy, but left with a confidence that would shape her life and career. “Those four years taught me to believe that with hard work, I could make a difference,” she shares. “Who’s the class that is so alive? We’re the Class of ‘95!”

After graduating, Maria attended the University of San Diego and soon found herself at the forefront of innovation. In 1999, she joined America’s Home Page, an early precursor to social media, where she was one of just four employees selected to remain after the dot-com bubble burst. Together, they created CashX, the first prepaid Visa credit card, bringing a brand-new solution to market. “It was exhilarating to help build something that didn’t yet exist,” she recalls.

Maria went on to become a founder of the first company granted regulatory approval to offer telemedicine visits. For the past 25 years, she has helped grow UpScriptHealth, expanding access to healthcare for patients nationwide. Her career has reinforced a lesson first learned at Carondelet: passion matters, and mistakes are opportunities to learn, solve problems, and do better next time.

Now living in Scottsdale, Arizona, Maria and her husband, who are former high school sweethearts and reunited years later, are raising their four daughters. Whenever she visits the Bay Area, she makes a point to drive by Carondelet. “The friendships, academics, and athletics gave me the courage to find my voice,” she says. “Carondelet laid the foundation for who I am today and gave me the confidence to make a difference in the world.”

SISTER KATHLEEN 'KATHY' LANG, CSJ (June 5, 1936–January 25, 2026)

Sister Kathy Lang dedicated 34 years of her life to Carondelet High School, profoundly impacting nearly 7,000 graduates and their families.

A Bay Area native, Sister Kathy's journey with Carondelet began in 1974. She served as a religion teacher, oversaw the student council, and took on the role of VP of Student Activities until 1982. After a brief four year hiatus, she returned as Principal until 2001. Following this, Sister Kathy became Carondelet's first President—a position she held with distinction until 2012.

Sister Kathy was devoted to Carondelet, and this year was her 70th CSJ Jubilarian year. Those who were on campus during her time will remember her for her gentle spirit, faithful leadership, and deep commitment to tuition assistance. She knew every student on campus, and she always made sure to know something special about each one of them.

Sister Kathy, will be remembered for her loyalty, leadership, legacy, and passion for Catholic education.
